Maharashtra is blessed with a 720 km long coastline. Shared with Konkan, Thane, and Ratnagiri also the Sindhudurg districts. Many marine creatures come to visit. However, the exact count and type are unknown. As from what is believed there is not a detailed study available. In the year 2000-01, it was found that a species of turtle, Olive Ridley is a prominent visitor to the shores of Maharashtra for breeding purposes. Other species are the Green Turtle, Hawksbill, and Leatherback. A lot of the other information is already available online, like what do turtles eat, and what a turtle looks like. The difference between a turtle, a tortoise, and a terrapin.

Why Velas Turtle Festival?

Velas is a small fishing village on the western coast of Maharashtra. About 220 km away from Mumbai, a little over a hundred houses on the coast of the Arabian Sea. It is that time of the year again - when a tiny grey head pokes out of the golden sand and takes a breath of the fresh salty air of the Arabian Sea. It is a culmination of a lengthy process, which started when, under the cover of darkness, its mother emerged out from the rolling waves to lay her heap of 100-120 eggs on the sandy beach. Oblivious to the world that awaits it outside its sandy cocoon, the tiny hatchling is soon followed by a hundred others, all crawling their way toward the brightest lights of the horizon- in this case, the sea. TreksandTrails, India invites you to this journey from the nest to the sea which draws



oohs and aahs from tourists - each of whom is gathered on the shore to witness this miracle of Nature. The location is Velas, a remote village in Mandangad taluka in Ratnagiri district approx. a 6-hour drive from Mumbai.

Velas Kasav Mahotsav 2025 is an annual event dedicated to conserving Olive Ridley turtles, one of the more endangered species. It is held at the beach of Velas in Ratnagiri, 220 kms from Mumbai. The Kasav Mahotsav 2025 was created to spread awareness of Olive Ridley Turtles, promote eco-tourism, and help raise money to protect and conserve these turtles. There are Rs 100 entry fees for the Velas Kasav Mahotsav 2025.

2. Where can I find olive ridley turtles on the Konkan coast?

Olive Ridley turtles can be found at many beaches along the Konkan coast, a few of which are mentioned here. Guhagar Beach, Harihar Beach, Velas Beach, Anjarle Beach, and Wayangani Beach, Vengurla. Some of the best beaches on the Konkan coast are nearby: Diveghar Beach, Shirvardhan Beach, Harihareshwar Beach, Kelshi Beach, Anjarle Beach, Karde Beach, Harney Beach, and Ladheghar Beach. Due to our limited time on tour, we will be covering only Harihareshwar Beach and Velas Beach.

The sea turtle festival is held from February to April, where you get to see the Turtle hatchlings being released at the Velas beach daily at 7 am and 6 pm.

About Olive Ridley Turtle

The Olive Ridley Turtle, whose scientific name is *Lepidochelys olivacea*, is the world's smallest and most common sea turtle. They can be found living in the warm oceans of the Pacific, Atlantic, and Indian. They have a heart-shaped carapace top shell, five to nine pairs of scutes, and are olive in color. The Olive Ridley's size and shape differ from place to place, with the most notable animals being found in West Africa.

Even though Olive Ridley sea turtles are primarily aquatic, which means they live in open water, they are also known to live near shorelines. They can be found worldwide in the tropics of the Atlantic, Pacific, and Indian oceans. Over 50% of the Olive Ridley sea turtle population on the globe and 90% of the Indian population of sea turtles assemble in Odisha, India, annually.

What is Olive Ridley sea turtle size?

The tiniest sea turtles are olive ridleys, which can weigh up to 100 pounds and have only about 2 feet long shells. The typical adult height might be between 22 and 30 inches (55 to 75 cm)

Maharashtra Olive Ridley sea turtle nesting sites

Around the Maharashtra coast, Olive Ridley turtles have sporadic nesting locations. In the southernmost part of the state, in the districts of Raigad, Ratnagiri, and Sindhudurg, nesting has been observed. The absence of people during the lockdown has been highly beneficial for Olive Ridley sea turtles hatching on the beaches of Maharashtra.

Odisha Olive Ridley sea turtle nesting sites

Olive Ridley sea turtles' most distinctive mass nesting behavior is found on Indian beaches near Gahirmatha beach in Odisha. Olive Ridley turtles' most prominent mass nesting location in India is on the Odisha beach of Gahirmatha¹. In the Ganjam district of Odisha, they have also been observed nesting close to the mouth of the Rushikulya river.



Olive Ridley Turtle Odisha

One of the significant mass nesting areas for Olive Ridley sea turtles is along the coast of Odisha, India. The largest Olive Ridley sea turtle nesting area in the world is on Gahirmatha beach in the Kendrapara district. The five locations where these turtles lay their eggs that the government has identified are Devi, Gahirmatha, Rushikulya, Bahuda, and Astarang.

Olive Ridley Sea Turtle Facts

Olive Ridley sea turtles are the second-smallest and most abundant sea turtles in the world. They are found in warm and tropical waters, primarily in the Pacific and Indian Oceans, but also in the warm waters of the Atlantic Ocean. They get their name from the coloring of their heart-shaped shell, which starts gray but becomes olive green once they are adults.

Here are some fun facts about Olive Ridley sea turtles:

- The Olive Ridley turtle got its name after the color of its carapace.
- An Olive Ridley lays up to 50-200 eggs at one time.
- Olive Ridleys were found at depths of 500 feet in the ocean.
- Olive Ridley sleeps underwater for up to two hours before they reach the surface for air.

What is the Olive Ridley turtle scientific name?

The scientific name for the Olive Ridley sea turtle is **Lepidochelys olivacea**.

Olive Ridley sea turtle diet?

Olive Ridley sea turtles have a varied diet. They feed on fish and invertebrates, including molluscs, fish eggs, lobsters, crabs, shrimps, sea urchins, and gelatinous animals such as jellyfish and algae. They can dive up to 150 meters or 492 feet to look for food.

Importance of Olive Ridley turtles

Olive Ridley turtles are essential to the environment because they feed on seagrass, which helps other sea species stay safe and help the oceans' oxygen and nutrients as part



of the ecosystem, crucial for life on Earth. They are currently the most abundant of all sea turtles.

Olive Ridley turtle nesting

Olive ridleys are known for their arribadas, or synchronized mass nesting, during which time tens of thousands of female ridleys come ashore to nest in a few days. They also exhibit solitary nesting behavior. The coast of Orissa in India is the largest mass nesting site for the Olive-ridley, followed by the beaches of Mexico and Costa Rica.

Are Olive Ridley turtles endangered?

The Endangered Species Act lists olive ridley turtles, which are widespread. In the Mexican Pacific Coast, only their breeding colony populations are considered endangered; all others are classified as threatened. The sea turtle is classified as fragile globally, and the federal government recognizes specific populations of olive ridleys as threatened and endangered.

What is the Olive Ridley sea turtle lifespan?

Like other sea turtles, Olive ridley turtles are likely long-lived. An olive ridley sea turtle's lifespan ranges from 30 to 50 years.

When is the Olive ridley turtle hatching season?

Olive Ridley Turtles head to the shore for the turtle nesting season between November and April. Each of them lays hundreds of eggs. The incubation takes about 40-50 days, and the hatchlings return to the sea.

How does the Olive Ridley turtle lay eggs?

The average Olive Ridley female turtle lays 120–150 eggs, and the young hatch after 45–60 days. Olive Ridley turtles spend hours creating tunnels in the sand using their front flippers. They make a cavity by sweeping sand out of the hole using their hind flippers. Many eggs are laid at once and later again covered in sand.

About project Olive Ridley turtle in India



Several projects in India aim to protect Olive Ridley turtles. The Ministry of Environment and Forests launched the Sea Turtle Conservation Project in November 1999 in collaboration with UNDP and the Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun, serving as the implementing agency. The Olive Ridley Project protects sea turtles and their habitats in the Indian Ocean by rescuing and rehabilitating injured sea turtles, researching and educating them, removing ghost gear from the ocean, and reducing and reusing ghost gear.

Tourists take care of the baby turtles that have just hatched by participating in the festival, supporting ecotourism, and providing income to local villagers who run homestays. Some tourists come to take pictures of the olive ridley turtle hatchlings making their way to the ocean, yet others come for the pure ecotourism experience the beach offers.

Olive Ridley Turtles' eggs are protected at the nest site after turtles are laid on the beach by turtles. The festival is held at Anjarle beach, an untouched and charming village. Many homestays are available right where the beach ends. Visitors can take a boat ride to Suvarnadurg Fort, watch the fish auction at Harney Beach, and shop for local produce from the market.

From February to April, you can see the hatchlings at Velas - the turtle breeding village. Accommodation is available at the homestay at Velas beach.

Do you visit Bankot fort at the Turtle festival Velas beach?

Yes, we will visit the Bankot Fort, an ancient fort that can also be referred to as Himmatgad Fort or Fort Victoria. It is found in the village of Bankot, in the Ratnagiri district of the Indian state of Maharashtra. The fort's location on a prominent and commanding point makes it ideal for defending the trade route that runs along the Savitri River, a popular route during the medieval era and extends to Mahad.

The red laterite surrounding the square-shaped Bankot fort has been dug up to create the moats surrounding it. Stone carvings adorn the front door, oriented to face north and the main entrance. There are vestibules for gatekeepers located close to the entrance. Steps leading toward Nagarkhana can be found on the left, while an underground storey and a tunnel can be found on the right. A small entrance Darwaja can be found to the west of the fortifications, and it leads to a bastion located outside the walls.
