About Devkund Waterfall Trek from Pune

The Devkund Waterfall, located near Bhira Dam in Maharashtra, India, is one place you can visit to rejuvenate yourself this rainy season and winter, or any other time of the year. The Devkund waterfall location is about 120 km away from Pune. Bhira waterfalls are accessible by hiking recommended during the Rainy season and winter months because it gets scorching and humid closed for the summer months. Devkund waterfalls Pune needs to be accessed only if adequate rainfall and dry up during summers.

Devkund waterfall trek is 175 kilometers from Mumbai, 115 kilometers from [Pune](#), and 90 kilometers from [Lonavala](#). Bhira, Patnus village in [Raigad](#) district, is the base village for the jungle waterfall trek in Maharashtra. Due to bad roads and heavy traffic, it will take 6 hours from Mumbai and 4 hours from Pune. You can take the Mumbai - Pune expressway and follow the Imagica to Pali to Devkund waterfall route.

Devkund waterfall trek is perfect for one day trek. The Falls, an amalgamation of three waterfalls, are regularly voted as the best jungle waterfall trek in India. You can dip your tired feet in the relaxing turquoise waters, enjoy the fish spa, and rejuvenate. The plunge waterfall changes colors depending on the time of the day, creating a magical and picture-perfect scene.



During the rainy season, the plunge waterfall, the origin of the Kundalika River, is fed by the Tamhini ghat, and the waterfall flow will be fierce. Be ready with waterproof cameras to capture the best moments of the monsoon waterfalls trek near Mumbai.

Devkund waterfall, also known as the "Bathing Pond of Gods," is a mystical waterfall with great mythological significance and is regarded as sacred by the villagers. It offers a natural pool for visitors to experience its pristine waters and indulge in a natural therapy session. The trek takes approximately three to four hours, covering a distance of six kilometers one way. The route, with its few perennial waterfalls, rocky outcrops, and lush jungle, presents a joyous and adventurous journey. The Devkund waterfall trek is a must-visit paradise for adventure enthusiasts, providing a fairy tale-like escape from the bustling city life.

1. How far is Devkund Waterfall from Pune?

Devkund Waterfall Bhira Dam has located 110 km from Pune. It takes around four hours to reach the Devkund Bhira Waterfall Parking from Pune. We will use the Tamhini ghat route to get Patnus village for this trek. Devkund waterfall trek distance is three kilometers one way it will take two hours to hike the distance from the trailhead. Devkund waterfall depth is 60 feet at the deepest end.

- People caught smoking or drinking alcohol will be asked to exit the event on an immediate basis.

- If you damage the tent, break the tent poles, you will have to pay us for the whole new tent on MRP.
- If you are late for the bus pickup and are not reachable on the phone during your bus pickup, the trek leader will leave without you, and we will provide no refund.
- Please check things to carry and wear trekking shoes on our treks.
