Nanemachi Waterfall Trek with Satsada Waterfall, from Mumbai and Pune

1 Night 1 Day | Easy Grade | Raigad District, Maharashtra | Best in Monsoon (June to September)

About the Nanemachi Waterfall Trek

The Nanemachi Waterfall is one of the most spectacular monsoon waterfalls in Maharashtra, tucked deep inside the dense forests of the Raigad district near Mahad. Plunging around 400 feet down a forested rock face into a deep blue pool, Nanemachi stays hidden from the regular tourist trail, which is exactly what makes it special. The pool shifts through shades of blue and green as the daylight changes, giving the spot an almost magical feel during the monsoon.

This is a waterfall discovery trek built for people who want raw, untouched nature without a punishing climb. The trail winds through thick green forest and gentle stream crossings, and on the same day you also visit the nearby Satsada Waterfall, making it a full two-waterfall monsoon experience from a single trip. It is an easy-grade trek that is perfect for first-timers, families, and anyone chasing the green-season Sahyadris.



Nanemachi Waterfall Trek Details

- **Waterfall Height:** Approximately 400 feet
- **Location:** Mahad Taluka, Raigad District, Maharashtra
- **Trek Distance:** 3 to 4 km (round trip)
- **Trek Grade:** Easy
- **Endurance Required:** Easy to Medium
- **Trail Type:** Dense forest trail with stream crossings
- **Time to Reach Waterfall:** About 1 hour from parking
- **Best Season:** Monsoon, June to September
- **Nearest Railway Stations:** Veer and Sape Wamne (near Mahad)
- **Distance from Mumbai:** About 240 km
- **Distance from Pune:** About 175 km

- **From Mumbai:** Rs. 1,699 per person
- **From Pune:** Rs. 1,499 per person

How to Book the Nanemachi Waterfall Trek

Booking your spot takes just a few minutes:

1. **Visit the Treks and Trails website** and open the Nanemachi Waterfall Trek page.
2. **Click the "Book Now" button** and select your departure date and city (Mumbai or Pune).
3. **Fill in your personal details** and apply any coupon code, such as EARLY75 for Rs. 75 off.
4. **Complete the payment** using UPI, debit card, credit card, or net banking.
5. **Receive your booking ID and confirmation email** instantly once payment is successful.

You will be added to the trek WhatsApp group about 5 hours before departure. Your trek guide will share all the necessary details there and manage the event from that point onward.



Tip: Use a valid email ID and an active WhatsApp number while booking, since all confirmations and trek updates are sent to them.

Nanemachi Waterfall Trek Itinerary (Mumbai and Pune)

The Nanemachi Waterfall trek is an overnight journey, with pickups starting Saturday night so you reach the Raigad base village by early Sunday morning and finish the waterfall hike before the midday heat. Below is the full pickup schedule and day plan for both the Mumbai and Pune departures.

Cancellation Policy

- 75% refund if notified via phone conversation 8 or more days prior to the event date.
- 50 % refund if notified via phone conversation 4 to 7 days prior to the event date.
- No refund if the cancellation requested is less than 3 days prior to the event date
- No show No Refund.
- Event Tickets cannot be transferred to another date against cancellation.
- Event Tickets cannot be transferred to another person against cancellation.
- If the event gets canceled we will refund "Trek Amount" only.
- If the event is canceled due to any natural calamity, political unrest or other such reasons beyond our control the same cancellation policy will apply.
- Refunds won't be issued if you cannot attend the event due to heavy rains, floods, traffic jams, car breakdowns or a personal medical emergency.
- Your booking cannot be shifted to another date if you cannot attend the event due to heavy rains, floods, traffic jams, car breakdowns, or a personal medical emergency.
- If your area is prone to flooding, traveling from a flooded area, heavy traffic, heavy rains, missing the train, or any other reason, if you cannot attend the event, we won't issue a refund or shift you to another date.
- Management won't be held responsible if you are stuck due to heavy rains, traffic jams, personal emergencies or floods during the event.
- If you are bringing kids, please understand the possibility of getting stuck or delayed. You might have to stay back due to heavy rains, floods, bus breakdowns, and rush at the trekking destination. We won't be able to refund or shift you to another date. You will have to wait it out till the weather clears.
- Due to bad weather, floods, sudden changes in government rules, and overcrowding at the destination trek, the organizer has the right to change the trekking destination.
- During the trek , due to any circumstances seen or unseen trek leader has the right to cancel the trek for safety reason. No refund shall be issued.

Monsoon Precaution and Safety

- Kindly carry dry bag or plastic bags for dry clothes, wallet, money, camera, phone, gadgets



- Bag or Backpack with rain cover
- Wear Good Trekking shoes with good grip (campus trekking shoes)
- Use Odmos or other repellents to keep bugs and mosquitoes away
- Wear only full sleeves / cap / full pants / dark coloured clothes
- Keep handy information on nearest railway station/bus stop/taxi stand
- Listen to Trek leader and always stay in the group
- Inform Family / Friends about where about
- Avoid taking selfies near risky places
- listening to music on earphones or speakers.

TREKS AND TRAILS EVENTS RULES

- Kindly carry one Identity proof, at least for the trek with your address.
- We all are going for an adventurous and exciting trekking expedition; please Do Not misinterpret it as a PICNIC or LEISURE TOUR.
- The leader's decision will be final, and all the members should abide by it.
- We do not destroy or dirty the archaeological, historical monuments, natural habitat on the trek.
- Swimming is not allowed in the lake or water tank on the forts. Locals use that water for drinking.
- Putting your feet in water tanks or on the canon is not allowed on our treks.
- Any addiction is strictly prohibited, e.g. drinking, smoking, chewing tobacco anyone caught doing it will have to exit the trek without a refund and travel back on own expense.
- People caught smoking or drinking alcohol will be asked to exit the event on an immediate basis.
- Please do not carry or wear any valuables, ornaments, jewellery, etc. If carried, then we Do Not take any liability for the same.
- Rock Climbing, Rappelling, Trekking, or any adventure activity is potentially risky. For all these events, you are at your own risk. Organizers are not responsible for any accident or compensation in whatsoever manner.
- We should strictly follow the code of conduct to avoid troubling our fellow trekkers or other people from our group or outside.
- Listening to music on earphones or Bluetooth speakers is not allowed while trekking.
- Bluetooth speaker not allowed inside the homestay or camping tents.



- Drinking/smoking,/eating is not allowed inside the tents.
- If you damage the tent, break the tent poles, you will have to pay us for the whole new tent on MRP.
- If you are late for the bus pickup and are not reachable on the phone during your bus pickup, the trek leader will leave without you, and we will provide no refund.
- Please check things to carry and wear trekking shoes on our treks.

Questions

Nanemachi Waterfall Trek: Complete Guide and FAQ

Is Jain food available on this trek? Yes. Please mention your Jain food requirement in the comments at the time of booking, or call us in advance, and we will arrange it.

Are washrooms available during the trek? Trekking routes in Maharashtra do not have washrooms. There is a stop at a villager's house with basic Indian-style toilets. A washbasin may not be available.

Is parking available at the base village? There is no designated parking spot. Locals may ask for a small parking fee, and vehicles are parked at the owner's own risk.

Are solo and female trekkers welcome? Absolutely. Solo trekkers are welcome, and we maintain a 6:4 male-to-female ratio on each trek, with a female trek leader assigned when available.

Can the bus reach late after the trek? Yes, delays can happen due to poor road conditions, breakdowns, punctures, bad weather, or Mumbai traffic from ongoing metro and bridge construction. If the bus is delayed, Treks and Trails is not liable for refunds or taxi or cab costs.



What should I pack for this monsoon trek? Carry a waterproof backpack with rain cover, a poncho or rainproof jacket, quick-drying clothes, trekking shoes with good grip, extra socks, a torch with spare batteries, 2 to 3 litres of water, energy snacks, a personal first-aid kit, and ID proof. Double-bag your phone and valuables in plastic.

Are leeches a problem on this trek? Yes, leeches are common on forested monsoon trails in Maharashtra. Wear long socks, tuck your trousers in, and apply insect repellent on your legs. Carrying a small salt or lime solution helps detach any leeches quickly.

Where is Nanemachi Waterfall located? Nanemachi Waterfall is in Mahad Taluka, Raigad district, Maharashtra, India, hidden inside a dense forest. The nearest town is Mahad, about 25 km from the base village. It lies roughly 240 km from Mumbai and 175 km from Pune, making it a popular weekend monsoon trek for both cities.

How tall is Nanemachi Waterfall? Nanemachi Waterfall is approximately 400 feet tall. It cascades down a forested rock face into a deep blue pool that shifts colour through the day. This height makes it one of the tallest and most scenic hidden monsoon waterfalls in the Raigad district of Maharashtra.

Is the Nanemachi Waterfall trek easy or difficult? The Nanemachi Waterfall trek is an easy-grade trek of 3 to 4 km round trip, taking about one hour to reach the falls from the base village. During monsoon the forest trail turns slippery, so trekking shoes with good grip are recommended, making it easy to moderate in the rains.

What is the best time to visit Nanemachi Waterfall? The best time to visit Nanemachi Waterfall is the monsoon, from



June to September, when the falls run at full flow and the forest is lush green. Outside the monsoon the waterfall has little to no water, so Nanemachi is strictly a monsoon-season trek and waterfall experience.

How do I reach Nanemachi Waterfall from Mumbai? From Mumbai, travel about 240 km to Mahad, then continue around 25 km to the base village by taxi or rickshaw. The journey takes six to seven hours. The easiest option is an organised overnight trek from Mumbai, which includes private AC bus transport, breakfast, lunch, and a trek leader.

How do I reach Nanemachi Waterfall from Pune? From Pune, travel about 175 km to Mahad via Bhore Ghat and Varandha Ghat, then around 25 km further to the base village. Joining a guided Pune departure is simplest, with transport, meals, and a trek leader bundled into one package for a hassle-free monsoon trek.

What is the entry fee for Nanemachi Waterfall? There is no formal entry ticket for Nanemachi Waterfall. Locals may charge a small parking fee at the base village, payable on the spot. On a Treks and Trails trek, all transport, meals, and guide costs are included in a single trek price of Rs. 1,649 from Mumbai or Rs. 1,499 from Pune.

Can you swim at Nanemachi Waterfall? Swimming is not allowed at Nanemachi Waterfall or in the pool below it, for safety reasons. The pool is deep and currents can be strong during monsoon. Trekkers should follow the trek leader's instructions and stay within sight of the guide at all times.

Does the Nanemachi trek include Satsada Waterfall? Yes. The Treks and Trails Nanemachi Waterfall trek also includes a visit to the nearby Satsada Waterfall on the same day, after returning from the main hike. This gives you two scenic Raigad waterfalls in a single overnight trip from Mumbai or



Pune.
