Day 1

Day 1: Delhi to Manali – Overnight Volvo Journey

📍 Majnu Ka Tilla

Departure for Manali - 5 pm

Your Himalayan backpacking trip begins from Delhi. Report at Majnu Ka Tilla in the evening and board your overnight Volvo to Manali. As the city lights fade, the mountains start calling. Overnight journey.

Day 2

Day 2: Arrival in Manali – Local Sightseeing & Old Manali Vibes

📍 Manali

Reach Manali in the morning and check into your hotel. After freshening up, explore the charm of Old Manali. Visit Hadimba Devi Temple, Manu Temple, stroll through Mall Road, or relax in cozy mountain cafés.

If you prefer a little adventure, trek to Jogini Waterfall through scenic forest trails. End your day with riverside views and café hopping.

Overnight stay in Manali.



🕒 Day 3

Day 3: Solang Valley – Atal Tunnel – Sissu

📍 Solang Valley

Start early and head to Solang Valley, the adventure hub of Manali. Try paragliding, ATV rides, skiing (seasonal), or simply enjoy the snow and mountain views.

Drive through the iconic Atal Tunnel and visit Sissu, a beautiful Himalayan village perfect for photos and peaceful moments.

Rohtang Pass can be added (seasonal and at extra cost).

Overnight stay in Manali.

🕒 Day 4

Day 4: Kullu Adventure – Transfer to Kasol

📍 Kasol

After breakfast, travel towards Kullu for optional river rafting in the Beas River or paragliding.

Later continue your scenic drive to Kasol, the backpacker hub of Parvati Valley. Visit Manikaran Gurudwara and the natural hot water springs before checking in.

In the evening, explore Kasol Market, enjoy café hopping, and soak in the relaxed mountain vibe.

Overnight stay in Kasol.



📍 Day 5

Day 5: Kheerganga Trek & Camping

📍 Kheerganga Trek

Drive to Barshaini, the starting point of the Kheerganga trek. Begin your 14 km scenic trek through pine forests, waterfalls, and stunning valley views.

Reach Kheerganga and relax near the famous natural hot water spring. Spend the night camping under a sky full of stars — one of the best backpacking experiences in Himachal.

Overnight stay in camps.

📍 Day 6

Day 6: Kheerganga to Jibhi – Hidden Himalayan Escape

📍 Tirthan Valley

After breakfast, descend back to Barshaini and travel towards Jibhi, a peaceful offbeat destination.

Check into your stay and enjoy the slow mountain life surrounded by wooden houses and forest views.

Overnight stay in Jibhi.

Day 7: Jibhi Sightseeing – Overnight to Delhi

📍 Jibhi

Explore Jibhi Waterfall, Mini Thailand, and nearby scenic viewpoints. If time permits, visit Chhoie Waterfall.

Later proceed to Aut and board your overnight bus to Delhi.

When is the best time to go backpacking in Manali, Tosh and Kasol?

The months of March through June are ideal for backpacking trips to Manali, Tosh, and Kasol. Clear skies and mild temperatures make these months perfect for outdoor adventures like hiking, camping, and trekking. Avoid going on a trek during the months of July and August, when the monsoon season is at its peak, as the heavy rains can cause the trails to become muddy and unsafe. It's also best to avoid the area between the months of December and February, when the snowfall is heavy and the temperatures dip into the negatives.

What are the best spots to visit while backpacking in Kasol?

Backpackers in Kasol can see a lot of amazing sights. Some of the top places to visit are listed here.

- At Barshaini, hikers can explore the Kheerganga Trek, a well-known route known for its verdant forests, beautiful waterfalls, and soothing hot springs.



- Malana Village is a special place, full of interesting traditions and famed for its Malana Cream hashish.
- Tosh Village is renowned for its beautiful scenery, apple orchards, and the hiking track that leads to the Tosh Glacier.
